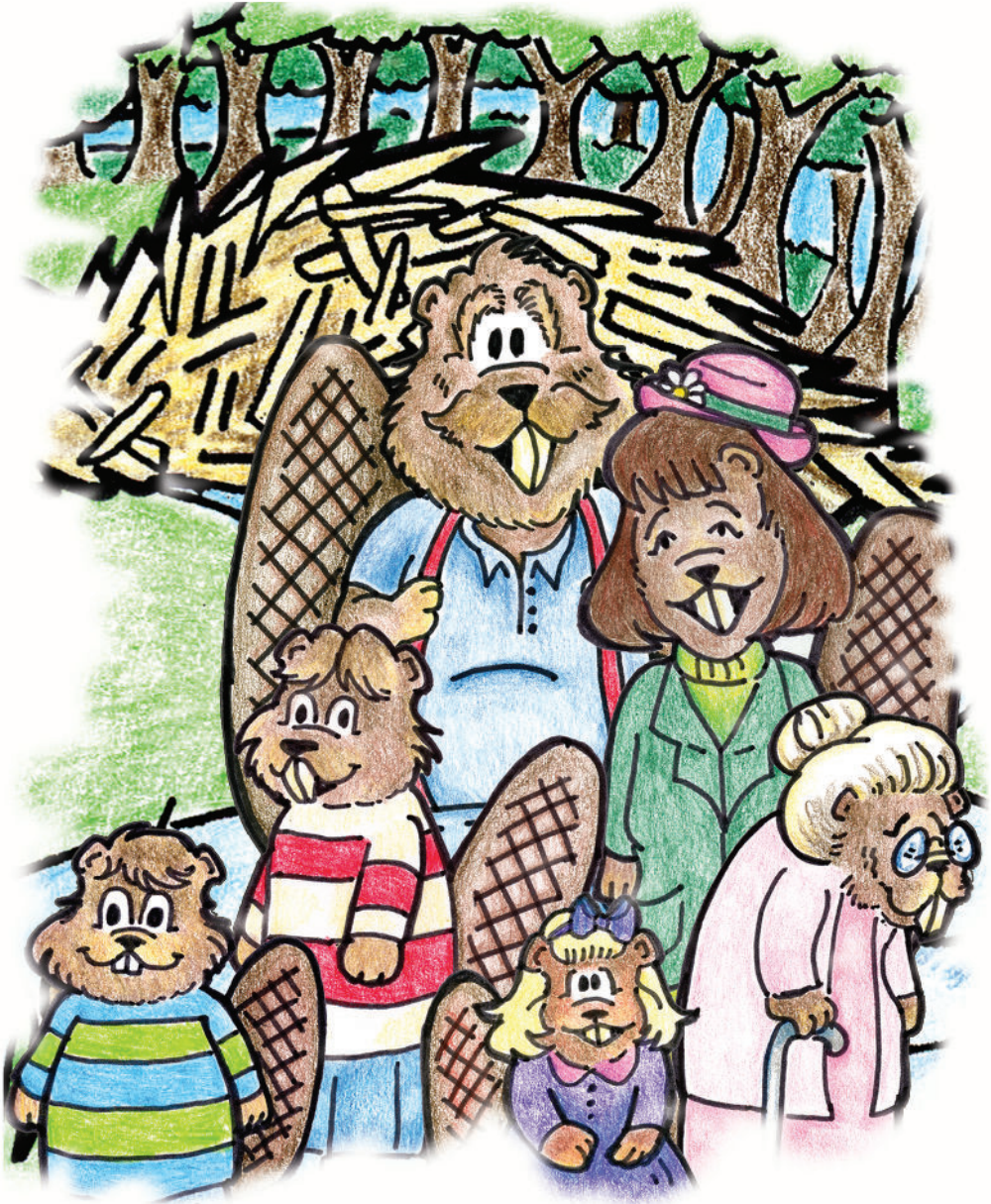


Joey's Mom is Going Away

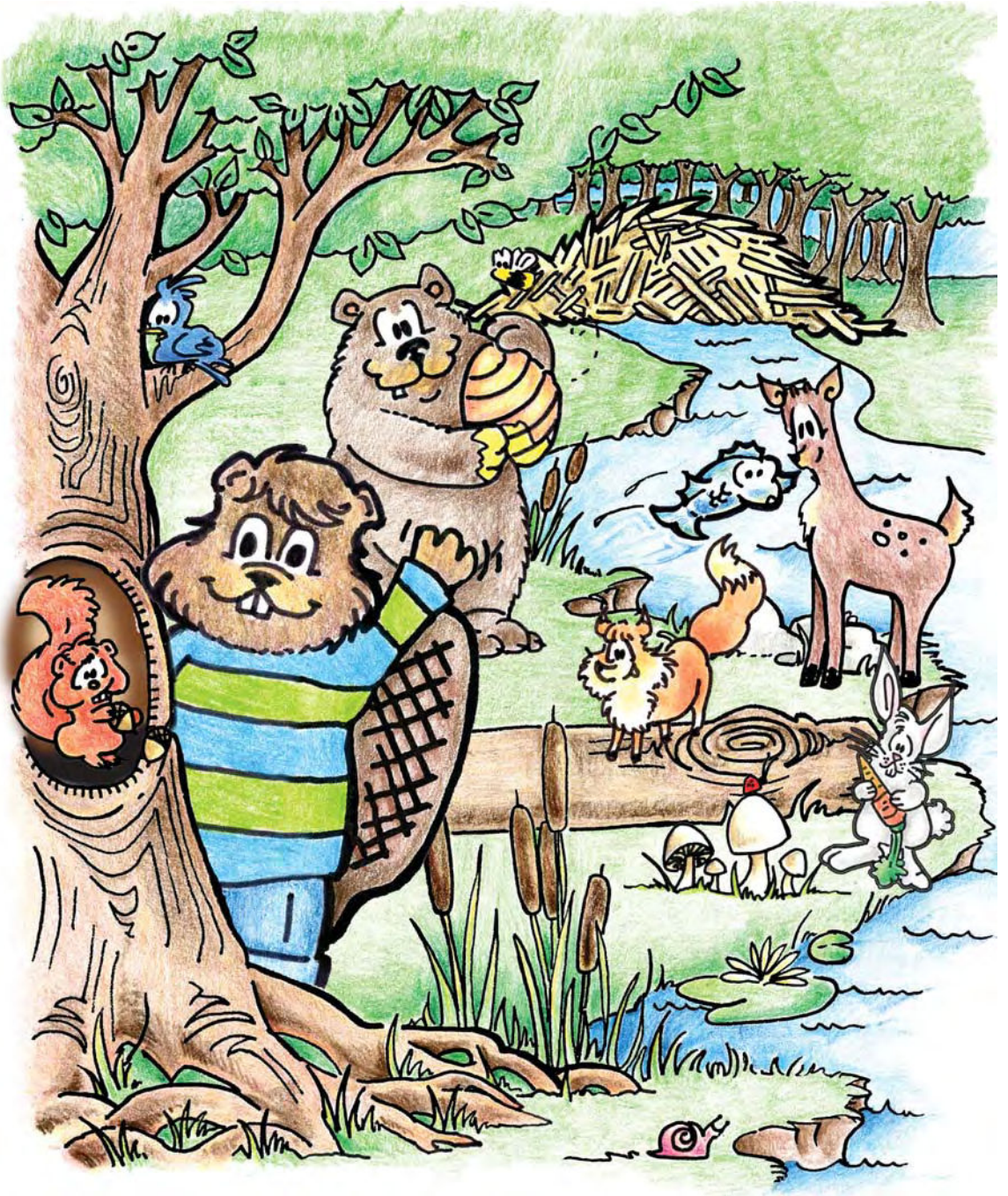

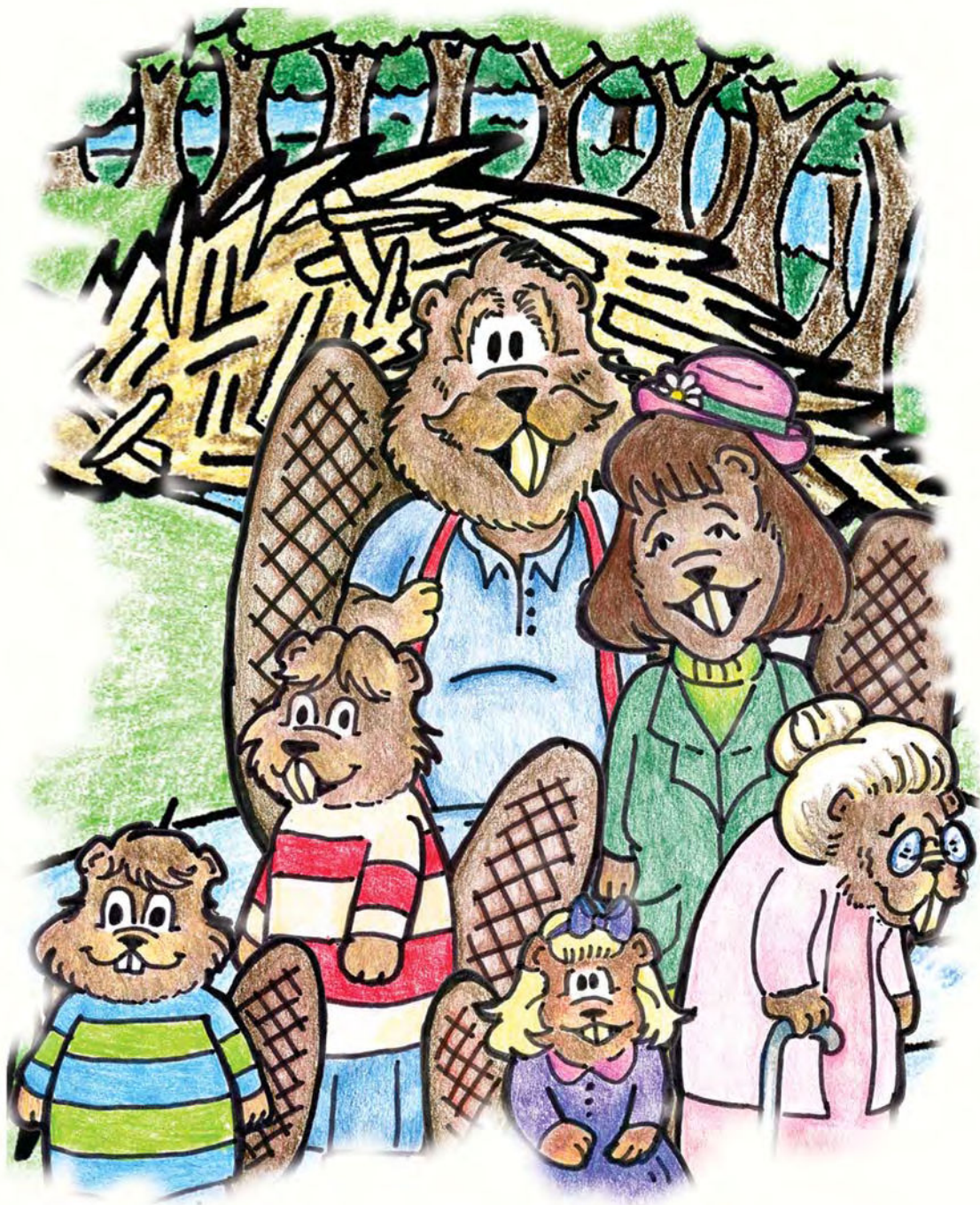

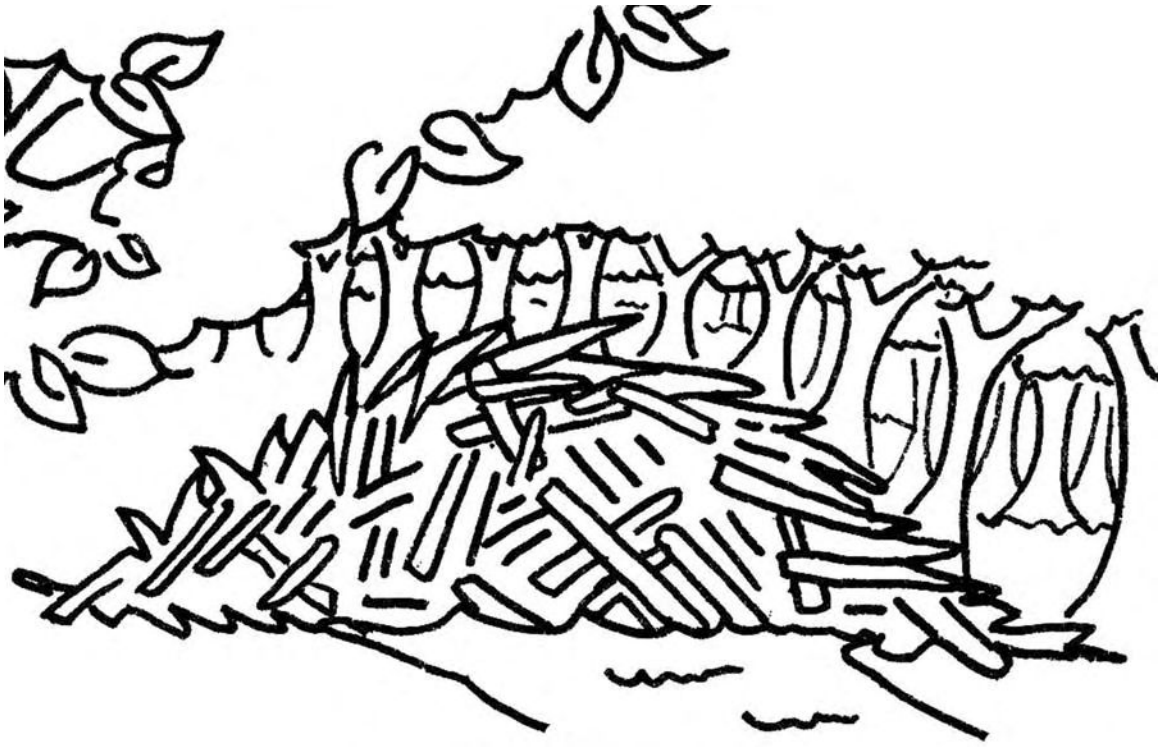




Joey is a four-year-old beaver that lives with his family near a small stream in a huge forest. It's a very peaceful place, where birds, squirrels and other animals live in harmony.



In Joey's house, there is Dad Beaver, Mom Beaver, a little sister and a big brother. Grandma lives with them too.



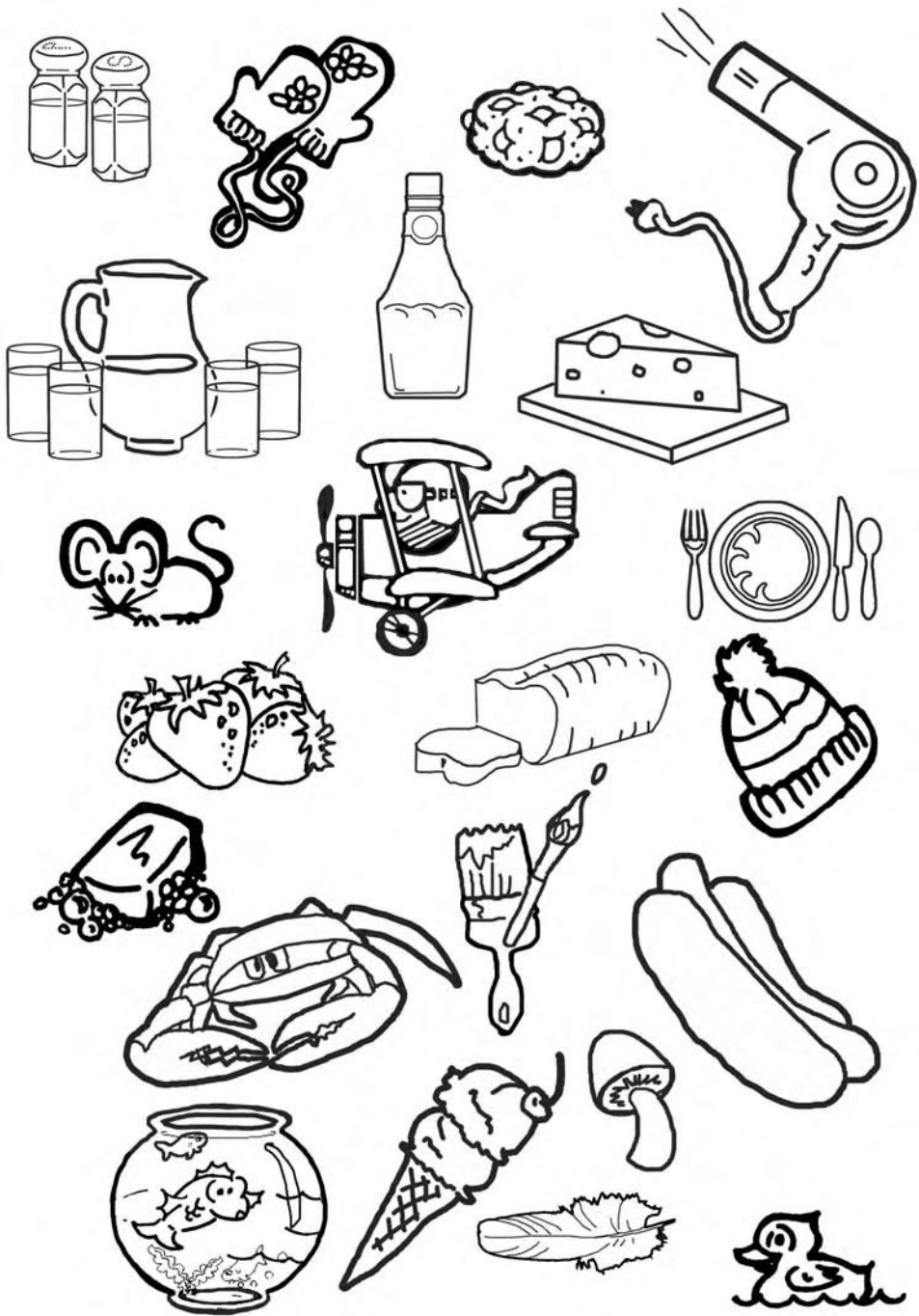
Draw your family on this page. You can also cut out and glue pictures.

Mom begins organizing her things to leave. Suddenly, it seems the whole house is a mess.



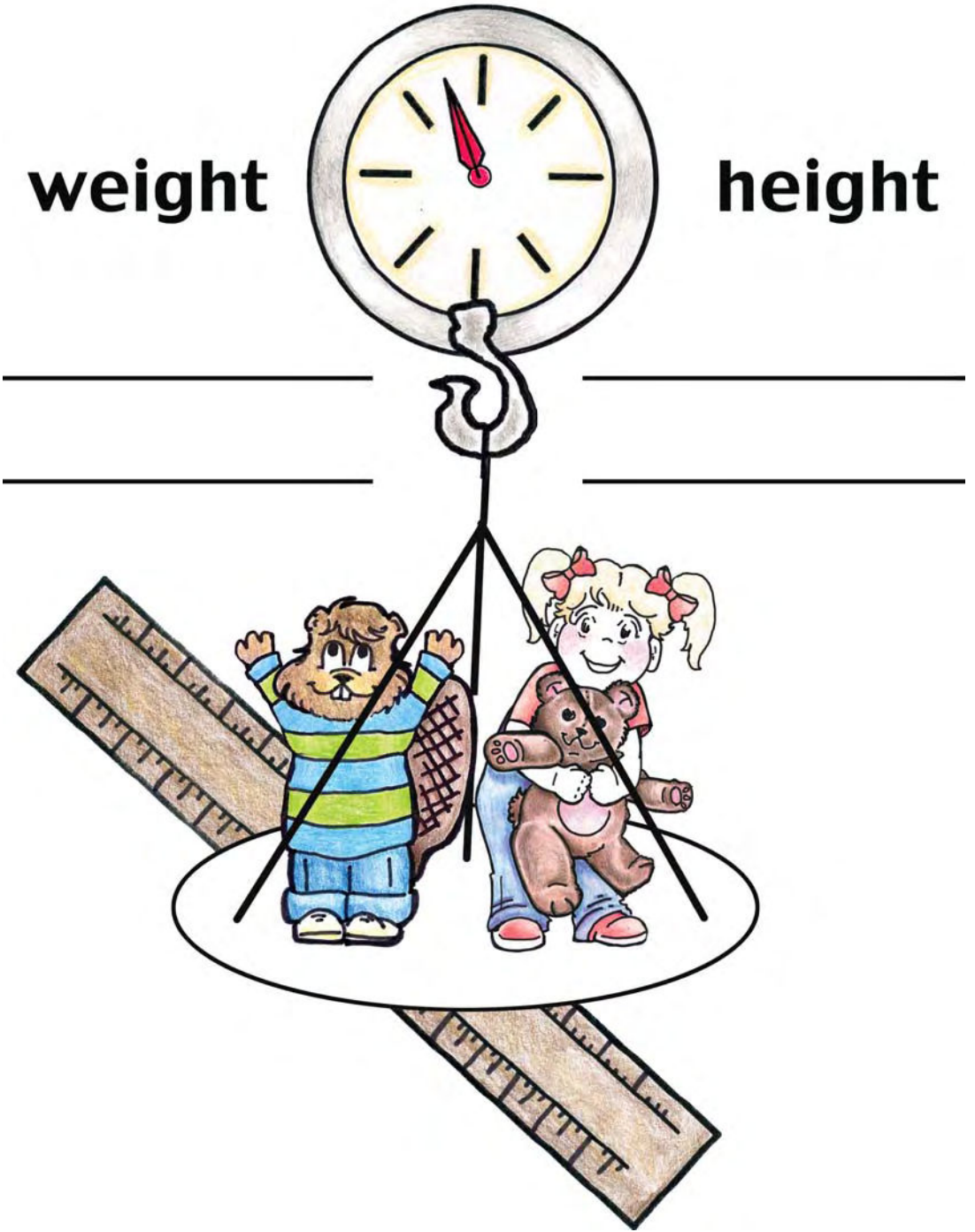
What preparations do you make to play outside? To go on a trip with Mom and Dad? To have a picnic? Circle the things you need to go on a picnic.

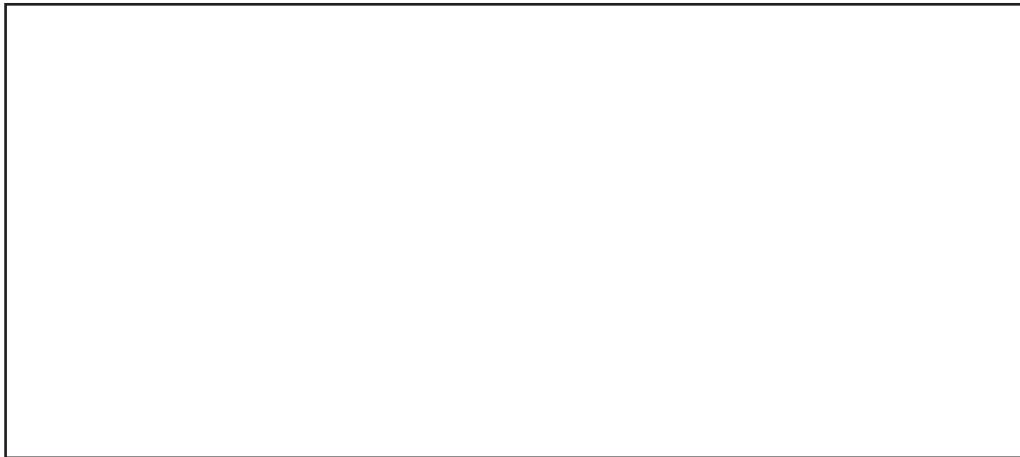
Glue the picture of your parent right here. You can decorate envelopes and writing paper for your parent to bring with him/her and write you letters.

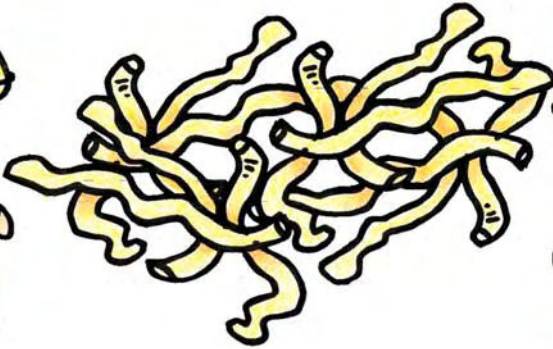

Dad must leave for one or two days to get supplies. During this time, Grandma stays alone with the three small beavers.

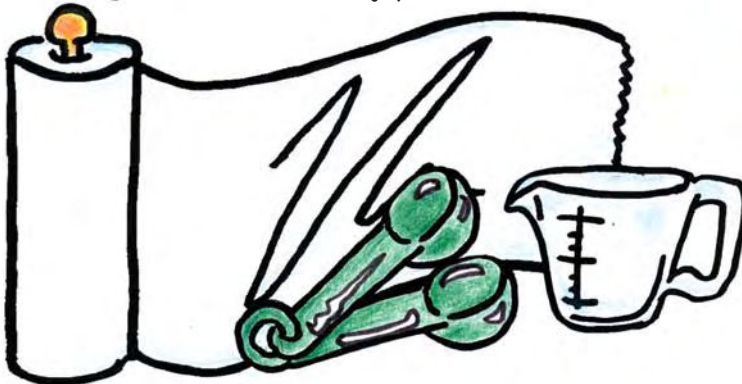
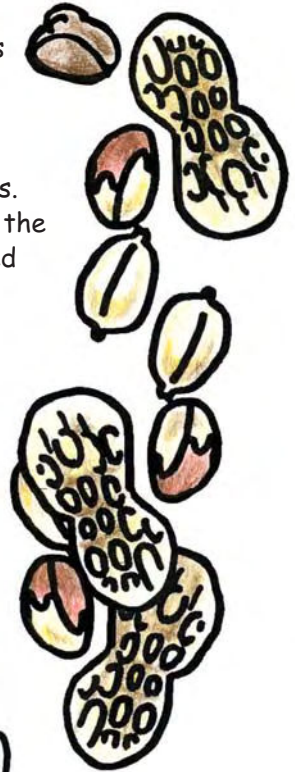
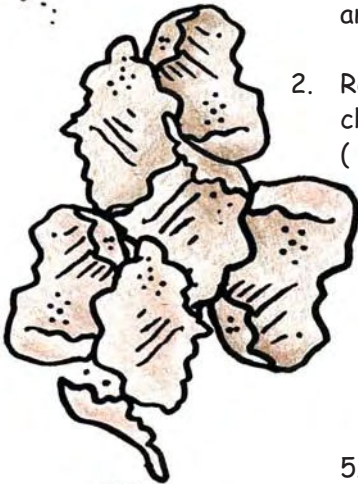


On those days, Joey and his big brother help Grandma bake their favourite cookies - birch bark cookies. Ummmmmmmm! They're good!



Birch Bark Cookies

1. Melt together 1 cup chocolate chips and 1 cup butterscotch chips.
2. Remove from heat and add 1 cup chow mein noodles and 1 cup peanuts. (You can substitute the noodles or the peanuts with unsweetened flaked cereal.)
3. Drop by teaspoon onto wax paper.
4. Chill until firm.
5. Enjoy!



Here's the birch bark cookie recipe. Ask an adult to help you bake them.



Some days, Grandma brings Joey and his little sister to the daycare centre. At the beginning, Joey's sister would cry a bit. When she saw all the new toys and all her friends, she quickly got over her unhappiness.

The beaver family often receives letters from Mom and everyone gathers around the table to read them.



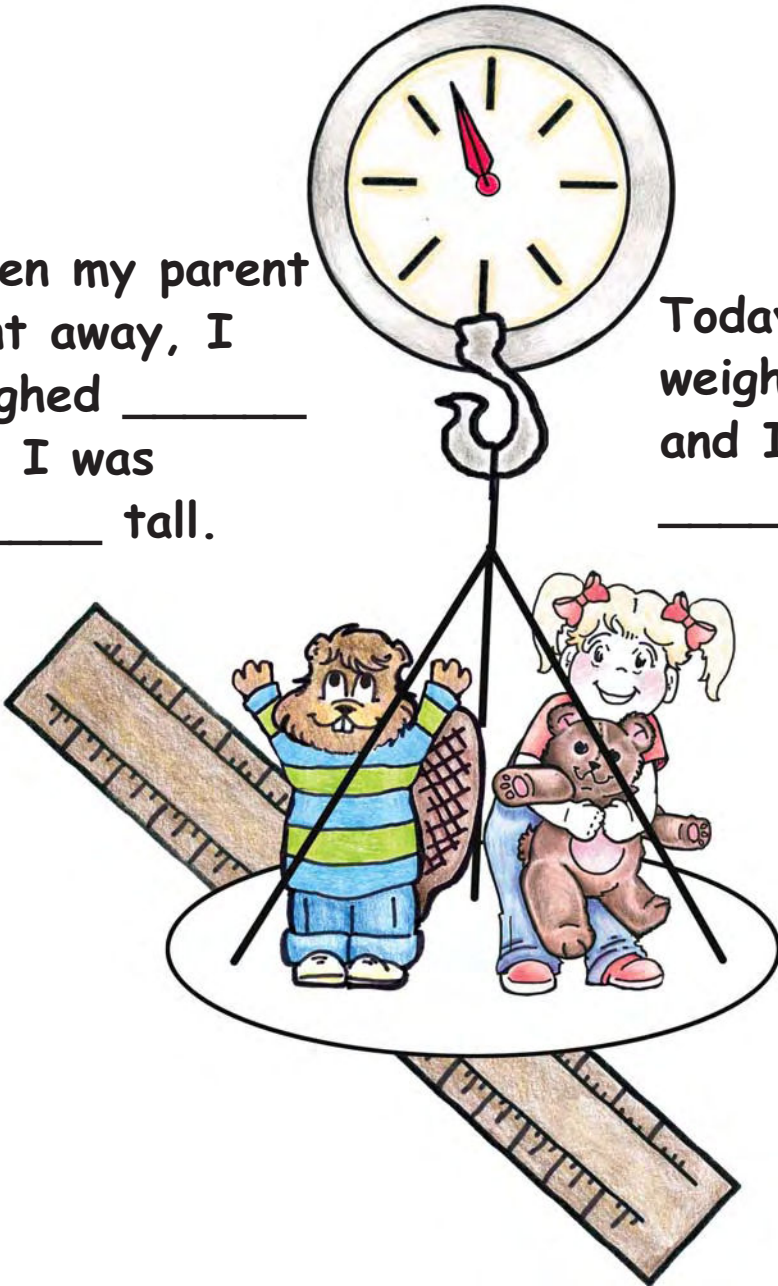

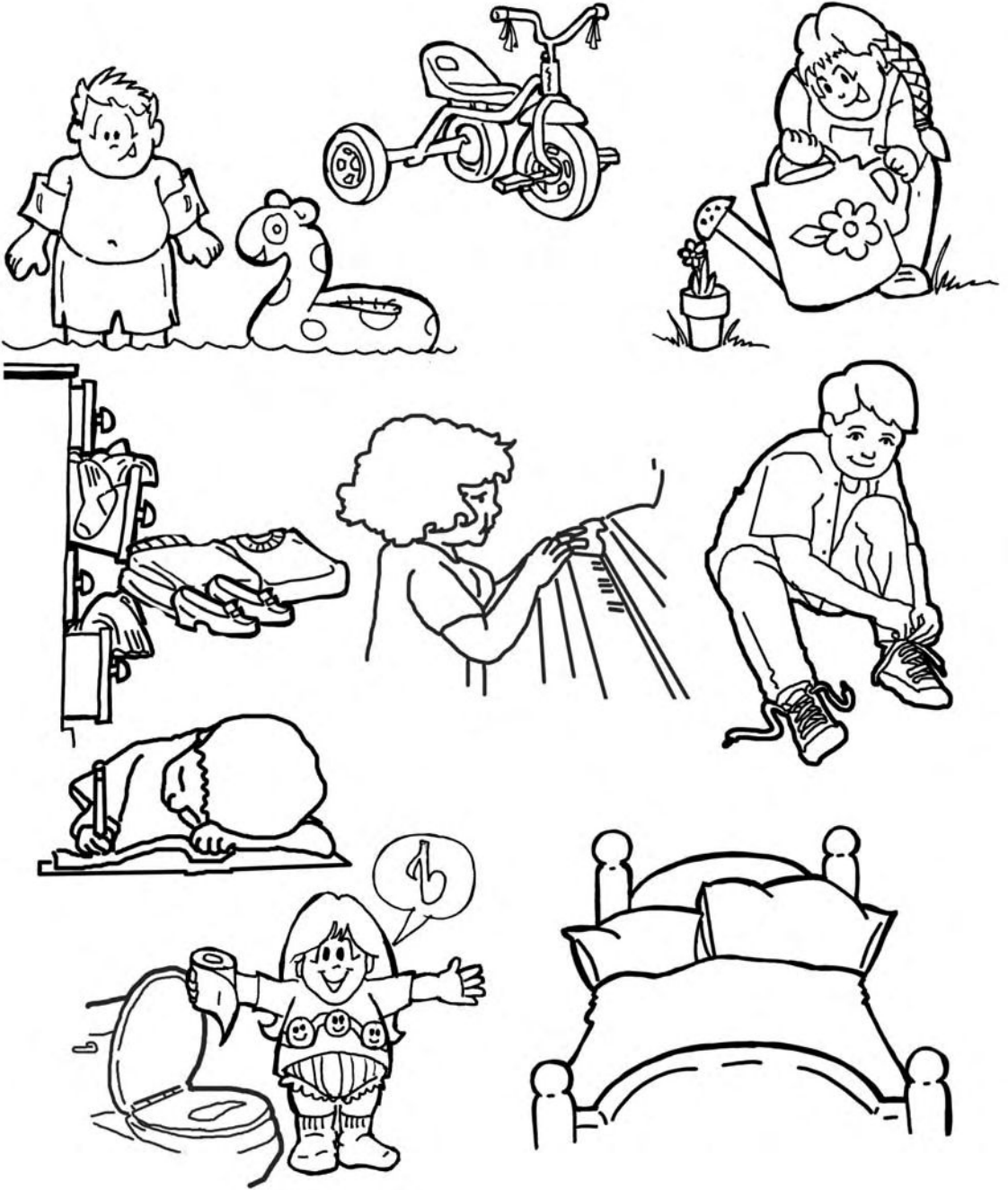
Joey is so anxious to see Mom. He wonders if she will recognize him. After all, his teeth are much larger than when she left, and his coat has become much darker.

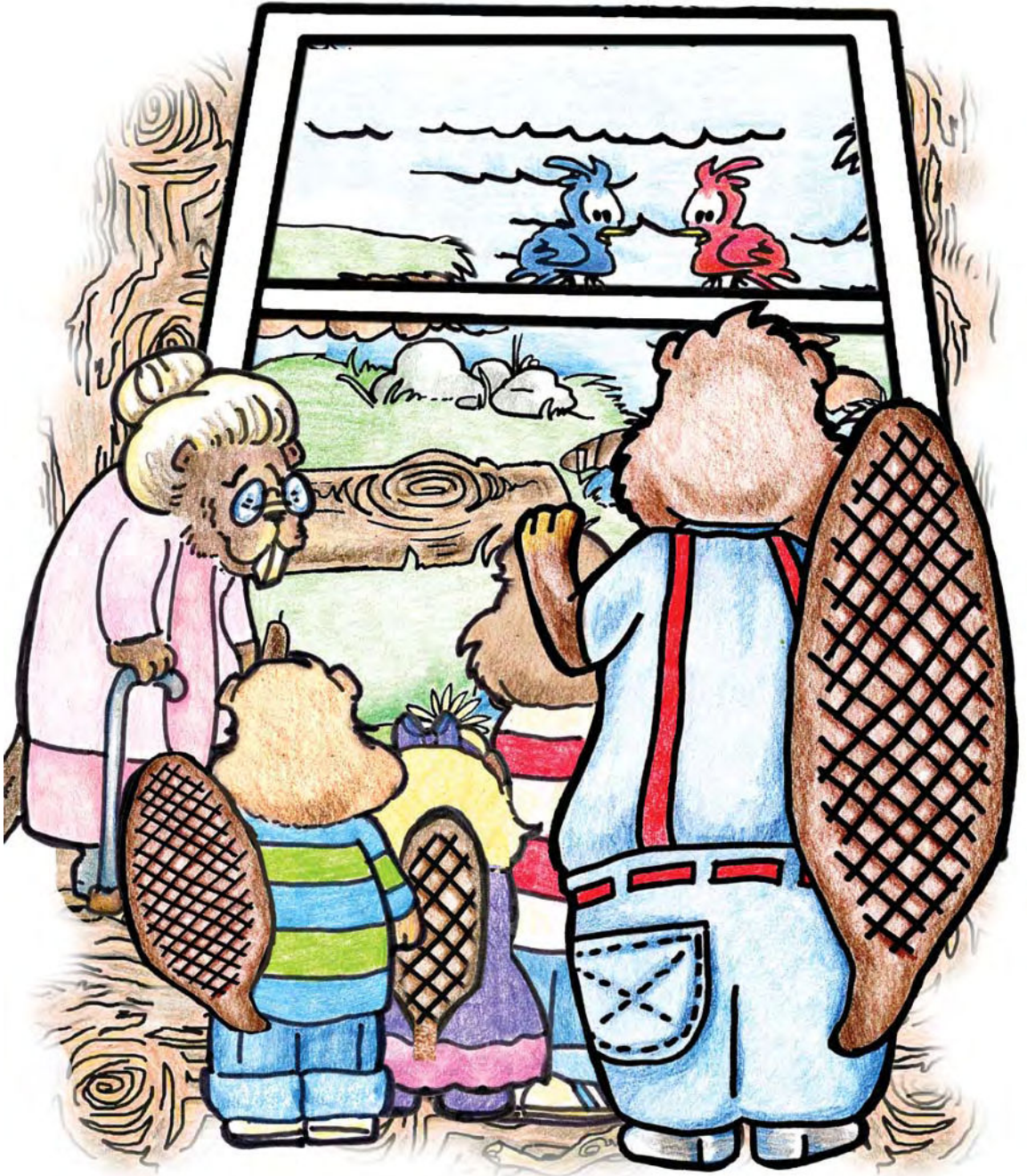

All the members of the family gather along the shore. The only thing left to find out is who will jump the highest and make the most noise. Mom has finally come home. Everyone's so happy!

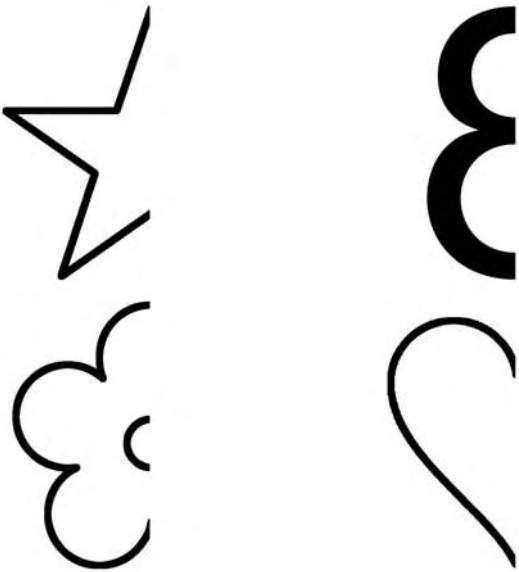


Can you find the differences between the two sets of pictures? (written at bottom of page)
